CROCHET – Beginner Level

Instructor: Cristin Berrafato

Class Size: Maximum of 10 students

Cost: \$30

Details: Student will learn increase and decrease. This class will make a swatch.

Material charge in classroom: \$2 for color copy of class pattern

“Join the Fun Hat Workshop”

KNITTING – Advanced Beginner

Instructor: Kay Mather

- Class Size: Maximum of 15 students
- Cost: \$35 (includes 2 balls of Noro Kureyon)
- Details: Students will learn to knit a custom striped, slouchy hat in the round using split joins. Split joins are an old hand spinner’s technique that is helpful to knitters – saves time at finishing. Students should be able to knit and purl within the same round. The 2 balls of Noro Kureyon necessary are included in fee and tips will be given to choose colors for 20+ stripes in hat.
- Material charge in classroom: Needles needed may be purchased in class for \$7.79 each.
- Supplies Needed in Classroom: Size US 7 and US 8, 16-inch circular needles. Stitch markers. Tapestry Needle, scissors.

“Cast Ons, Joins and Bind Offs”

KNITTING – At minimum an Advanced Beginner (should be able to knit at a good pace.)

Instructor: Lara Geller

- Class Size: Maximum of 15 students
- Cost: \$60
- Details: A packed class of tips and ways to improve your knitting and your finish.

In this class you will learn/review

At least five ways to cast-on, potentially including but not limited to

- long-tail
- knitted
- backwards loop
- twisted German
- Judy’s magic cast-on
- cable cast on

At least five ways to join yarns, potentially including but not limited to

- Simply knitting with new yarn while carrying the old behind
- Spit-Splicing
- Magic Knot joins
- Russian joins
- Flawless joining method

At least five ways to bind-off, potentially including but not limited to

- Standard
- Suspended
- Invisible ribbed
- Jenny’s surprisingly stretchy
- Decrease methods
- I-Cord

- Material charge in classroom: NONE
- Supplies Needed in Classroom: At least **5 sets of needles** that works with the weight of yarn you bring to class. A crochet hook corresponding to the weight of the yarn that you bring. An array of at least **10 scraps of stash yarn of various fibers** (at least 25 yds of each), and **at least 2 of pure animal fiber**. Tapestry Needle, sharp scissors.

“Oops, Fixing Your Knitting Mistakes – From Learning to Knit to Becoming a Knitter”

KNITTING – Advanced Beginner to Intermediate (should be comfortable reading patterns, making items and knowing all the basics.)

Instructor: Lara Geller

- Class Size: Maximum of 15 students
- Cost: \$60
- Details: In this class you will learn how to FIX some of the MOST COMMON mistakes that knitters (even experienced ones) make. The difference is that an experienced knitter can FIX their mistakes so they can continue with their project instead of ripping it all out OR shoving it in the closet or adding it to the UFO pile, never to be seen again.
- Wouldn't it be nice to have that level of independence in your knitting practice?! Want to learn how to properly UN-KNIT without losing your stitches? Are your stitches TWISTED? Did you PURL instead of KNIT and need to fix that ONE stitch without ripping out multiple rows? DROPPED a stitch and need to SAVE it?? AND MORE!
- If you have been knitting for a while and get stuck and frustrated when your stitch count is off, when you realize you made a mistake a few rows back and don't know what to do, or even if you have no idea what you did wrong but know "something" is wrong.....THIS IS THE CLASS YOU HAVE BEEN WAITING FOR! Completion of this class will be extremely liberating to your knitting practice.
- Material charge in classroom: NONE
- Supplies Needed in Classroom: 2 contrasting colors of Plain light-colored worsted weight yarn, corresponding size knitting needles, corresponding size crochet hook. Tapestry Needle, sharp scissors.
- Homework: **Must be completed prior to class.**

With color A, cast on 25

Rows 1-5 - Knit

Row 6 - K12, P1, K12

Rows 7-10 - Knit

Rows 11-16 - K2, P2

Switch to color B

Row 17- Knit

Row 18 - Purl

Row 19- K10, K1TBL, K14

Row 20-21 continue in Stockinette Stitch

Row 22 - P12, K1, P12

Rows 23-27 continue in Stockinette Stitch

“Free Fall into Open Spaces”

KNITTING – Intermediate Knitter to Advance Knitter

Instructor: Cornelia Tuttle Hamilton

- Class Size: Maximum of 20 students
- Cost: \$60
- Details: Students will learn how to make any size geometric holes in their knitting without breaking the yarn for the columns. The instructor developed this drop stitch technique. For examples, please visit her web page at hamiltonyarns.com and check out *Geometric Openwork*.
- Material charge in classroom: NONE
- Supplies Needed in Classroom: Range of needles from US 6 (4MM) to US 8 (5MM). Worsted weight or Aran weight yarn – 1 self-striping and 1 solid. Tapestry Needle, sharp scissors.

KNITTING – Intermediate Knitter

- Class Size: Maximum of 8 students
- Cost: \$35
- Details: Students will learn to use the Brioche stitch to create a lofty, stretchy wide-ribbed fabric that is an interesting hybrid of K1P1 ribbing and double knit. Beginning a scarf with one color brioche is relatively simple, or you can add the reversible striping effect of using 2 colors.
- Material charge in classroom: NONE
- Supplies Needed in Classroom: Worsted weight wool yarn in 2 colors – wool brand needs to have elasticity. US 7 needles either dpns or circular
- Homework: NONE

“My First Crochet Slippers”

CROCHET – Beginner Level

- Class Size: Maximum of 10 students
- Cost: \$30
- Details: Student will learn how to make their first slipper. Increase/decrease stitches and front post double crochet/back post double crochet will be taught.
- Material charge in classroom: \$3 for color copy of class pattern – instructor’s original design.
- Supplies Needed in Classroom: Worsted weigh yarn (#4) – 1 skein of Super Saver in any color. Size “H” Crochet Hook. Tapestry Needle, scissors.

CROCHET – Beginner Level

- Class Size: Maximum of 8 students
- Cost: \$30
- Details: This is a beginning crochet class. The student will learn the first steps in crocheting, i.e. hooks, yarn, and basic stitches, as well as getting started on a scarf project.

“Windfall – Mitred Shortrowing, Surface Weaving, 2 Stitch Cabling, Openwork Ridges and Much More!”

KNITTING – Intermediate to Skilled

Instructor: Cornelia Tuttle Hamilton

- Class Size: Maximum of 20 students
- Cost: \$60
- Details: During this workshop you will learn methods for mitred shortrowing, surface weaving, 2 stitch cabling, openwork ridges and more. You will be looking at garments from the instructor’s book, *“Windfall”* and making swatches of the different techniques.

“Double Knitting: Twice the Knitting Fun/Half the Work – Kinda!”

KNITTING – Advanced Beginner to Intermediate Level

Instructor: Lara Geller

- Class Size: Maximum of 10 students
- Cost: \$60
- Details: Double Knitting is a fun way to produce a reversible colored fabric that's two layers thick with two fabrics are knitted simultaneously on one pair of needles. Stockinette stitch shows on BOTH sides and the color patterning is reversed on the opposite side. You will first work a stitch from the side of the fabric facing you and then you will work a matching stitch from the opposite side of the fabric. The fabrics may be inseparable, as in interlock knitted fabrics, or they can simply be two unconnected fabrics. You can use this technique to do color work, such as Fair Isle, without having a "wrong-side" or "back" to the fabric. It really takes your knitting to the next level and for those who hate to sew (me, me, me!) it is a seamless 2-sided project. As a result of this technique you will also learn how to cast on purl stitches which is applicable to any ribbing or patterned project that includes purls in the first row.

“Tunisian Crochet”

CROCHET – Advanced Beginner

- Class Size: Maximum of 10 students
- Cost: \$25
- Details: Students will learn a new crochet technique, Tunisian Crochet Stitch. This is a great pattern for gift bags, purses, dishcloths and coasters. The technique is easy to apply. Great for left over yarn projects. We will be making a mini gift bag and if time allows a coaster.
- Material charge in classroom: \$5 for cotton yarn, if student needs it.
- Supplies Needed in Classroom: Cotton yarn and crochet hook set. Scissors.

“4 Techniques for Knitting in the Round – Small Circumference Knitting!”

KNITTING – Advanced Beginner Level

Instructor: Kay Mather

- Class Size: Maximum of 10 students
- Cost: \$40
- Details: Students will learn to knit in the round with one circular needle, double point needles, magic loop, and 2 circular needles for many uses, including small circumference knitting. Knitting in the round is used for seamless sweaters and hats, where small circumference knitting is necessary to make socks, gloves, mittens, sleeves, and tops of hats that are not seamed. Add these techniques to your knitting toolbox!
- Material charge in classroom: NONE
- Supplies Needed in Classroom: 25 grams smooth worsted weight yarn, double point needles/16” circular needle/a second circular needle in any length. Needles can be from size 7 – 9 US
- Homework: NONE
