KNITTING – ADVANCED Beginners and higher

“NOT Brioche – Cheater’s Edition”

- Class Size: Maximum of 14 students
- Cost: \$30
- Details: Brioche knitting has gained a reputation for being extremely difficult and hard to learn. Learn a technique that gives you the same look and feel as squishy as lofty Brioche knitting. Perhaps you will gain enough confidence to eventually pursue Brioche knitting. You will learn to work this ribbing flat with almost no purling.
- Supplies Needed in Classroom: 2 contrasting colors of “smooth” yarn, weight #4 – 2 oz of each is sufficient to practice.
 - Short circular (16”) knitting needles size 6 or 7
 - **OR** 2 double pointed needles size 6 or 7
 - **OR** straight needles. 1 locking stitch marker and knitting tool kit.
- If student wishes to make a hot pad, 1 skein of cotton yarn, size #4 is sufficient.
- If student wishes to knit a twisted headband, 1 skein yarn, DK size #3 is suggested – smooth acrylic or blend.

KNITTING – ADVANCED KNITTER (should be able to knit at a good pace.)

“Mittens Both Ways”

- Class Size: Maximum of 10 students
- Cost: \$50
- Details: These fun mittens are knit completely opposite but manage to match in the end! Designed to maximize learned techniques, *the first mitten is knit **top down** and the second one is knit **cuff up**.*
- Techniques Used:
 - Turkish cast on and German twisted cast on
 - Knitting in the round with magic loop
 - Forethought thumb
 - KFB increases
 - SSK and K2tog decreases
 - Picking up stitches
 - Kitchener stitch grafting
 - Drawstring finish for thumb
- Material charge in classroom: \$3.60 for pattern (regularly \$6)
- Supplies Needed in Classroom:
 - **2** full skeins worsted weight yarn 300 yds/skein: same color or contrasting color
 - **2** – 32” or 40” circular needles corresponding to yarn weight
 - Waste yarn in contrasting color (smooth yarn that doesn’t split)
 - Locking stitch markers
 - Tapestry needle
 - Scissors

CROCHET – Advanced Beginner to Intermediate (will be a fast moving pace)

“Ditch the Chain: First Row Crochet Magic”

- Class Size: Maximum of 14 students
- Cost: \$20
- Details: Hate to crochet that first row? The foundational stitch technique combines the chain and one standard crochet stitch. In this manner the foundation chain and the first row/round of stitches are worked at the same time. It can be applied to any crochet stitch.
- Supplies Needed in Classroom:
 - 1 skein worsted weight yarn, solid color
 - 1 skein of boucle or other hard to work with yarn (optional)
 - Crochet hook corresponding with yarn weight
 - Tapestry needle
 - scissors

CROCHET – Intermediate to Advance Crocheter

“Tunisian Stitch – Working with 2 colors and learning Houndstooth pattern”

- Class Size: Maximum of 10 students
- Cost: \$25
- Details: Using Tunisian stitch with 2 contrasting color and crocheting the Houndstooth pattern. The pattern can be used to create a cowl, blanket or vest.
- Supplies Needed in Classroom:
 - Long Tunisian hook – size US K, 6.5mm
 - 2 contrasting color yarn – preferably chunky fluffy yarn (light colors) – one solid and the other can be variegated or contrasting solid color.
 - Cotton yarn will work best for stripe pattern
- Homework: NONE

KNITTING – Intermediate Level Knitters

“Brioche for Intermediate Knitters”

- Class Size: Maximum of 12 students
- Cost: \$30
- Details: Brioche is a technique that has become very popular recently. Using skills that you already know, you can begin to understand how brioche is worked and gain enough confidence that you will be able to knit these lofty and reversible stitches.
 - Terminology and chart reading will be introduced.
 - Instructions and demonstrations will show flat and circular brioche in one and two colors.
 - Patterns will be provided for multiple projects suitable for beginning brioche knitters.
 - Additional techniques and tricks will be demonstrated to improve your knitting – such as “reading” your knitting, how to place a proactive lifeline, how to add selvages including I-cord
- Material available in classroom: Students will need 2 contrasting colors of “smooth” yarn, weight #4
 - 2 oz of each color should be sufficient
 - 16” circular needles, size 6 or 7
 - Optional: double pointed needles (2) size 6 or 7, or straight needles
 - 1 locking stitch marker
 - Brioche hot pad, requires 1 skein of cotton yarn, size #4
 - Twisted headband requires 1 skein yarn, DK or size #3 is suggested – smooth acrylic or blend.
- Supplies Needed in Classroom:
 - Knitting tool kit
